


Classic Rome & Florence



Highlights

Explore 2 of Italy's most romantic cities on this 8 day tour from the historic capital Rome to Florence in the heart of Tuscany.

Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive into Rome and enjoy a welcome drink.

Day 2: Explore Rome with a guided walking tour and visit to the Colosseum and Roman Forum. Enjoy a 3 course dinner with a glass of wine at a local restaurant.

Day 3: Discover more of Rome with a guided coach city sightseeing tour followed by a visit to the Vatican Museum.

Day 4: Free day for further sightseeing in Rome.

Day 5: Transfer by coach with a guide from Rome to Florence. Stop along the way to see San Gimignano and enjoy lunch at San Donato Fattoria di Fenzi. Here you will have the option for a wine tasting and extra virgin olive oil lesson.

Day 6: See Florence with a guided coach city sightseeing tour followed by a visit to Accademia Gallery. End the day with dinner and wine tasting at Castello Verrazano.

Day 7: Guided full day excursion to Cinque Terre.

Day 8: Free time in Florence before departure.
